Kuwait University and Kuwait Vision 2035

Kuwait University (KU), as the nation's flagship higher education institution, plays a central role in advancing the goals of Kuwait Vision 2035 — “New Kuwait.” This vision aspires to transform Kuwait into a diversified, knowledge-based, and sustainable economy led by innovation and human capital development. As an academic body, KU contributes directly to this transformation through education, research, and community engagement that foster economic resilience, environmental stewardship, and social well-being.

Aligned with the seven pillars of Vision 2035, notably Creative Human Capital, Sustainable Living Environment, and Sustainable Diversified Economy, KU integrates sustainability across its teaching, research, and operations. From embedding the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) into curricula and research agendas to promoting responsible campus operations and green infrastructure, KU seeks to translate national sustainability objectives into measurable academic and societal outcomes. The university's efforts reflect Kuwait's broader commitment to international frameworks, including the Paris Agreement and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

Through strategic partnerships with government agencies, the private sector, and international organizations such as the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Kuwait Foundation for the Advancement of Sciences (KFAS), KU advances knowledge and innovation that support evidence-based policymaking. As Kuwait's academic engine of progress, the university views sustainability not merely as an institutional goal but as a national responsibility, a means to empower future generations, strengthen Kuwait's global standing, and ensure prosperity and environmental balance for decades to come.

Quality

A core focus aimed at embedding a culture of excellence and quality across all academic and administrative processes by enhancing performance standards, obtaining international academic accreditations, and improving services for students and faculty to achieve the highest levels of efficiency and transparency.

Sustainability

A fundamental pillar in the university's efforts to make sustainability an institutional approach and a daily practice embraced by all its members—students, faculty, and staff—through raising environmental awareness, promoting eco-friendly practices, and applying sound management of natural and human resources to ensure continuity of development for future generations.

Innovation

A key direction aimed at fostering an environment that stimulates creativity and applied scientific research by supporting entrepreneurial projects, investing in modern technologies, and adopting innovative solutions that enhance the educational process and achieve leadership in research and development.

Global Visibility

A strategic focus on strengthening Kuwait University's regional and global standing by improving international rankings, building strategic partnerships with leading academic

and research institutions, and expanding scientific and intellectual influence to reflect the university's identity as a platform for excellence and thought leadership.

Kuwait University's Progress in Achieving Sustainable Development Goals for the Academic Year 2023/2024



SDG 1: No Poverty

Kuwait University places great emphasis on achieving the first Sustainable Development Goal—eradicating poverty and ensuring educational equity and equal opportunities. The university has launched numerous initiatives to support students from low-income groups by providing scholarships, financial assistance, and support funds, in addition to academic exchange programs that offer equal educational opportunities. These efforts contribute to empowering students academically and socially,

reinforcing the university's role in building a more just and sustainable society.

1. [Kuwait University Student Fund](#)

- Provides monthly financial assistance to needy students to facilitate the completion of their university studies.
- Requires students to be full-time and not receive any external income.
- Assistance covers tuition fees and essential supplies.



2. Undergraduate and Graduate Scholarships

- Full or partial scholarships, including tuition fee waivers.

- Monthly stipend to cover basic expenses.
- Free or subsidized health insurance and university housing.
- Annual travel tickets for certain categories.

3. Student Exchange Programs

- Provide equal educational opportunities and enhance students' academic experiences across different countries.

4. Kuwait Foundation for the Advancement of Sciences (KFAS) Scholarships

- Support academically outstanding students in graduate studies locally and internationally.
- Cover tuition costs and provide specialized training programs.



Additionally, Kuwait University has been certified as a **Healthy City from the World Health Organization (WHO)**, reflecting the university's commitment to providing an environment that supports health and well-being—an integral part of combating poverty by improving the quality of life for students and staff.





SDG 2: Zero Hunger

Kuwait University is committed to achieving the second Sustainable Development Goal—ending hunger and ensuring food security and proper nutrition—through a range of initiatives and programs. The university has focused on promoting nutritional awareness, supporting scientific research in sustainable agriculture and healthy nutrition, and developing strategic partnerships with international organizations such as the United Nations and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO). It has also launched

awareness campaigns, courses, and workshops aimed at building a healthy university community aligned with sustainability requirements.

1. Food Security and Health Programs on Campus

- Training programs in sustainable agriculture and nutrition, including courses and workshops on modern farming techniques, water resource management, and biodiversity protection for seeds and plants.
- Training programs and courses related to food security and sustainable consumption organized by the College of Life Sciences, including a course on *Sustainable Development Goals and Kuwait Vision 2035* in collaboration with the Ministry of Electricity, Water, and Renewable Energy.
- Nutritional and health awareness programs by Medical Colleges: College of Medicine, College of Pharmacy, College of Dentistry, College of Allied Health Sciences, College of Public Health and College of Life Sciences through campaigns targeting students and the community to promote healthy eating, combat obesity, and prevent malnutrition, contributing to the SDG of eliminating hunger and malnutrition.

2. Supporting Research in Nutrition and Environmental Sustainability

- Support research related to environmental, social, and economic sustainability, including studies focused on food security, improved nutrition, and sustainable agriculture—key elements for achieving zero hunger.
- Support research in healthy nutrition, sustainable farming, and reducing food waste, contributing to improved food security locally and regionally.

3. Partnerships with International and Local Institutions to Support Food Security

- Collaborate with global and local organizations such as the United Nations and Public Authority for Food and Nutrition on food security programs and implement sustainable agricultural practices to combat climate change and drought.
- Organize workshops such as “*Sustainable Food Chains and Systems*” featuring experts from Kuwait University’s College of Life Sciences and local companies, focusing on sustainable agriculture as a vital principle for sustainable living, supporting local farmers, encouraging organic products, and promoting the concept of sustainability in food security as defined by the United Nations.

SDG 3: Good Health and Well-Being

Kuwait University is committed to achieving the third Sustainable Development Goal—ensuring good health and well-being—by providing a healthy and safe campus environment and certified as a **Healthy City** in accordance with World Health Organization standards. The university has launched health awareness programs, vaccination campaigns, and initiatives to promote physical activity and proper nutrition among students and staff. In addition, it supports scientific research in

public health and chronic diseases, contributing to improved quality of life within and beyond the academic community.

1. Health Awareness and Prevention Programs

- Organizing awareness campaigns on healthy nutrition, anti-smoking, mental health, Annual Women health campaign in October, and prevention of chronic diseases.
- Providing vaccination campaigns and health education services for all campus visitors.
- Conducting campaigns to offer essential vaccines against infectious diseases, along with awareness programs for preventing chronic illnesses such as diabetes and heart disease.



2. Combating Smoking and Harmful Substances

- Implement smoke-free building policies across campus and organize awareness campaigns to reduce drug use and harmful substances.
- Provide a specialized anti-smoking clinic on campus to serve visitors.



3. Promoting Physical Activity and Sports

- Encourage participation in physical activities through events and sports competitions that promote a healthy lifestyle, including the annual campus marathon with over 2,500 participants from inside and outside the university.



4. Supporting Research in Public Health

- Fund research in infectious and non-infectious diseases, mental health, and vaccines, contributing to innovative solutions for improving community health.



5. Enhancing Mental Health and Social Well-Being

- Launch programs to support mental health, including counselling sessions and awareness campaigns on stress management and emotional balance.
- Provide mental health offices in all university colleges to serve students.





SDG 4: Quality Education

This SDG represents a core pillar of Kuwait University's mission, as the university strives to supply the labour market with qualified graduates who possess the competence, knowledge, and skills necessary to serve society and contribute to national economic development. The university places special emphasis on enhancing the quality of education, recognizing it as the greatest challenge for modern higher education institutions, and works to align its programs and academic standards with global

benchmarks to ensure quality and excellence.

1. Applying Quality Standards in Higher Education

Kuwait University is committed to improving the quality of its educational system at multiple levels, including:

- **Institutional Quality:** Implementing international academic accreditation systems for scientific programs across various colleges, and Institutional accreditation with National Bureau for Accreditation and Quality (NBAQ), Kuwait.
- **Student Quality:** Adopting systems to assess student performance and measure employer satisfaction with graduates.
- **Faculty Quality:** Applying rigorous regulations for recruitment, promotion, and scholarships to leading global universities.

2. Equal Access to Higher Education for Both Genders

Kuwait University is committed to equality and equal educational opportunities for qualified male and female students, using high school success rates as the primary criterion for university admission.



3. Developing Technical and Professional Skills Among Youth

The university aims to prepare graduates with exceptional skills through:

- Integrating technical and life skills into university curricula.
- Implementing field training programs and applied graduation projects across colleges.
- Organizing general and professional training programs through the Centre for Community Service and Continuing Education, targeting youth and professionals to enhance technical skills.



4. Inclusion of Students with Disabilities in Higher Education

Kuwait University is committed to ensuring educational inclusion for all students, including those with disabilities, by:

- Providing fully equipped university facilities to meet their needs on campus.

- Facilitating academic, administrative, and technical services through the Social Care Department.
- Incorporating universal accessibility standards in the design of new buildings at Kuwait University.



5. Supporting Scholarships and International Cultural Exchange

The university strengthens academic and cultural cooperation with friendly nations through scholarship programs, offering:

- Annual scholarships for students from various countries.

6. Lifelong Learning and Community Service

Kuwait University promotes a culture of continuous learning and community engagement through:

- Organizing public lectures and free educational workshops open to the public.
- Implementing short-term professional training and development programs for workers in various sectors.
- Participating in awareness activities outside campus, including schools and local communities.
- Ensuring these activities are accessible to all without discrimination based on gender, disability, or origin.



SDG 5: Gender Equality

Kuwait University is committed to achieving full gender equality and empowering women in all academic, research, and professional fields, in line with its mission to ensure fairness and equal educational and career opportunities, and in alignment with Kuwait Vision 2035 and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. The university believes that empowering women is a key element in achieving sustainable national development and balanced economic and social growth.

1. Promoting Leadership Representation and Full Participation of Women

Recognizing the importance of ensuring women's full and effective participation and equal opportunities for leadership at all levels of decision-making, Kuwait University has worked to strengthen women's academic and administrative roles by:

- Increasing the proportion of female leaders in colleges and senior administrative positions.
- Implementing fair promotion and recruitment policies without discrimination.
- Involving female academics in university decision-making committees and college councils.

2. Initiatives of the Women's Studies and Research Centre

Through the Women's Studies and Research Centre at the College of Social Sciences, the university has launched pioneering national projects and programs, including:

- The “*Empowering Women in Community Development*” project under the national development plan.
- Hosting scientific conferences to exchange expertise on women's empowerment.
- Preparing national studies and reports on women's status and challenges.
- Launching the annual *Outstanding Woman Award* with nominees from several Arab and foreign countries.
- Continuing collaboration between Kuwait University's Women's Studies and Research Centre, UN Women, and UNDP through research and policies that promote women's participation in the labour market and leadership roles.
- Kuwait has launched national initiatives for women's empowerment under Kuwait Vision 2035, in coordination with Kuwait University, to provide equal opportunities in education, employment, and entrepreneurship.



3. Enhancing Women's Inclusion in Higher Education

- Women represent a high percentage in scientific and engineering disciplines at Kuwait University, with female students accounting for about 70% in STEM fields—a strong indicator of enhanced access to higher education for women.
- The university adheres to fairness, transparency, and inclusivity in admissions, in line with Articles (7) and (29) of the Kuwaiti Constitution. Given that female students constitute 77% of total graduates, the university applies a gender-sensitive framework to ensure balanced representation across programs. Admission policies include:
 - Allocating certain academic programs, such as kindergarten and elementary education, exclusively for female students in accordance with professional norms.

- Applying flexible admission standards in female-dominated disciplines to achieve academic balance.
 - Publishing annual admission lists publicly, including data on admitted students by gender and college.
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4. Participation in Conferences and Events

- The College of Social Sciences hosted the 50th Conference on Women's Empowerment under the theme "*Local and Regional Initiatives for Human Rights Protection: Challenges and Solutions*", featuring experts and academics from the Gulf and Arab world. The event included workshops and exhibitions highlighting positive experiences in protecting human rights.
 - The university launched the *Academy X* initiative to support women's empowerment in technology and entrepreneurship, in line with Kuwait Vision 2035.
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5. University Facilities Supporting Women

The university provides safe and well-equipped housing for female students under the regulations issued by the Deanship of Student Affairs, including:

- Transportation and accommodation services for female students coming from outside Kuwait.
- Supervision systems and visitation policies ensuring comfort, safety, and equal educational participation.

This system enhances female students' ability to pursue academic achievement without social or geographical barriers, directly supporting SDG 5.

- **Women's Basketball Team:** Secured second place in the Third Higher Education Sports Tournament.
- **Eng. Asmaa Al-Ateeq – College of Life Sciences:** Won second place in the KSAAEM Environmental Competition.
- Recognition of outstanding female employees under the annual Administrative Excellence Award.





SDG 6: Clean Water and Sanitation

The university has worked to improve water resource management, reduce water consumption through modern systems, and provide safe sanitation facilities that comply with international standards.  - **Environment Public Authority (EPA).**






SDG 7: Affordable and Clean Energy

The university has adopted energy-efficient lighting systems, installed solar panels to generate electricity in selected buildings, and launched awareness campaigns to promote energy conservation among students and staff. Additionally, the university supports scientific research in

renewable energy and energy efficiency, contributing to a sustainable campus environment and reinforcing its role in combating climate change.

1. Implementing Energy-Saving Systems on Campus

- Applying energy-efficient lighting technologies in university buildings and using modern devices that reduce electricity consumption, helping to lower carbon emissions.

6. International Research Partnerships


Collaborate with global universities and research centres to develop innovative solutions in solar and wind energy, enhancing the university's position in sustainable innovation.

SDG 8: Decent Work and Economic Growth

Kuwait University is committed to achieving the eighth Sustainable Development Goal—promoting sustainable economic growth and providing decent work opportunities—by developing an educational and research environment that supports innovation and entrepreneurship. The university has launched training programs and initiatives to prepare students for the labour market, in addition to supporting entrepreneurial

projects through business incubation and partnerships with public and private sectors. It also contributes to strengthening the knowledge economy through scientific research and providing on-campus employment opportunities, thereby fostering sustainable economic development.

1. Training and Preparation Programs for the Labour Market

- The university has launched specialized training programs to prepare students and graduates for the labour market, including technical and entrepreneurial skills, to enhance decent work opportunities and economic growth. The Deanship of Student Affairs introduced programs focusing on essential skills for employment, covering four main categories: technical skills, professional skills, personal and value-based skills, and readiness for employment and fieldwork after graduation.
- The university organized the annual career fair “*Your Bridge to the Future*”, featuring more than 25 public and private sector entities, offering students direct interaction with companies and institutions and access to training and employment opportunities.



2. Enhancing Academic Programs with Market-Oriented Specializations

- Cybersecurity in the Computer Science Department.
- Financial and Actuarial Mathematics in the Mathematics Department.
- Data Analytics in the Statistics Department.



3. Providing On-Campus Employment Opportunities

- Offer student employment opportunities in administrative and technical fields on campus, helping students gain practical experience and earn additional income.



4. Promoting Equality in the Workplace

- Adhere to policies that prevent discrimination and ensure a fair work environment for all employees and faculty members, in line with decent work standards.

5. Partnerships with Public and Private Sectors

- Collaborate with government institutions and private companies to provide training and employment opportunities for students and graduates and strengthen the link between education and the labour market through field training programs in cooperation with private sector companies. These partnerships prepare students for careers in banking, healthcare,



engineering, and law.



Kuwait University has entered into numerous agreements for research collaboration and the exchange of expertise with a wide range of local and international institutions



6. Supporting Research in Economics and Development

- Fund research in sustainable economic growth, financial policies, and technological innovation, contributing to advanced economic solutions. Examples include studies titled “*The Role of the Knowledge Economy in Achieving Sustainable Development in Kuwait*”, which examined the impact of innovation, information technology, and scientific research on economic growth using Knowledge Economy Index (KEI) indicators and analyzed the causal relationship between these factors and sustainable development.



SDG 9: Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure

Kuwait University is committed to achieving the ninth Sustainable Development Goal—promoting sustainable infrastructure, supporting innovation, and advancing industry through investment in scientific research and modern technologies. The university has established advanced research centres in engineering and technology, launched programs to support entrepreneurship and innovation, and developed infrastructure at Kuwait

University in line with global sustainability standards. It also works to build partnerships with local and international institutions to foster industrial innovation and implement smart solutions across various sectors.

1. Launch of Kuwait's First Satellite (KuwaitSat-1)

- Kuwait University launched the first Kuwaiti satellite in collaboration with the Kuwait Foundation for the Advancement of Sciences (KFAS), Mohammed Bin Rashid Space Centre, and the University of Colorado Boulder. The satellite was launched aboard a Falcon 9 rocket from Cape Canaveral, Florida. The project aims to support scientific research in space and strengthen national capabilities in advanced technology.



2. Hosting the 43rd Engineering Design Exhibition

- The College of Engineering and Petroleum at Kuwait University organized the 43rd Engineering Design Exhibition, showcasing innovative student projects in engineering and technology, supported by KFAS. This reflects the university's commitment to encouraging innovation and entrepreneurship.



3. Enhancing Infrastructure

- Design of the Medical Campus at Kuwait University, which will house all medical science centres and the university hospital, increase capacity and strengthen research in medical and engineering fields.
- Announced the initial handover of the student housing buildings (male and female) and the Hospitality Club building at Kuwait University — a key step in developing sustainable and modern campus infrastructure.
- Inaugurated the Citizen Service Center at Kuwait University – Al-Shadadiya, in cooperation with the Ministry of Interior, enhancing service accessibility and administrative efficiency.
- Opened the Emergency Medical Center at Kuwait University in collaboration with the Ministry of Health, strengthening health and safety infrastructure on campus.
- Launched a Smoking Cessation Clinic at the College of Life Sciences in partnership with the Kuwaiti Society for Smoking and Cancer Control, supporting community health and sustainable well-being initiatives.
- The Information Systems Center obtained ISO 9001 (Quality Management) and ISO 27001 (Information Security Management) certifications from the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) after meeting comprehensive global standards and requirements.
- The Security and Safety Department launched an electronic health form to monitor students' health status, provide primary healthcare services, and improve emergency response within the university community.

- The Research Sector organized a workshop on “Using the R System for Data Analysis”, promoting research innovation and advanced data analysis skills.
- The Student Affairs Deanship – Social Care Department (Disability Services Section) held a pilot event to establish a digital library for students with disabilities at the Central Library in Kuwait University.






